

ESA/ESTEC Membership for all external fencers

General Conditions

The ESA/ESTEC facility is a secure site.

External fencers are only allowed access to the ESA/ESTEC facilities when they have been issued with an access badge which is initiated by the responsible ESA/ESTEC employee and member of the Committee of the ESA/ESTEC Fencing Club.

Initially a visitor's badge is generated for a fencer each time when he, or she takes part in the 4-week trial period. Should a fencer, after this trial period, decide to become a member of the ESTEC Fencing Club and the Application Form at the front is fully completed and signed, then the process for a regular Club Member badge will be initiated for him, or her.

After the 4-week trial period, the fencer shall either join KNAS as part of the ESA/ESTEC Fencing Club, or shall provide proof of KNAS membership associated with another fencing club.

This Club Member badge will give a member of the ESA/ESTEC Fencing Club access to the Escape sports facilities only to take part in the fencing activities during the slot times on Wednesday and with prior approval also on Monday during the lunchtime fencing slot.

When an external member of the ESA/ESTEC Fencing Club should decide not to continue his, or her club membership, or when the Committee of the ESA/ESTEC Fencing Club decides to discontinue the membership of one of its external members, then this member is requested to hand in his, or her Club Member badge upon leaving the ESA/ESTEC site.

Youngsters, up to 16 years old, joining the ESTEC Fencing Club shall at least for the first two months be accompanied by a parent, or adult family member, in order to acquaint themselves with the running of the fencing training sessions, how instructions are taken from the coaches and general conduct manners during interactions with fencers and Committee members.

ESA/ESTEC is a controlled site and therefore youngsters shall be accompanied by a parent or adult family member to gain access until they reach the age of 16.

The ESA/ESTEC Fencing Club Committee reserves the right to refuse any application for or renewal of membership on the basis of non-acceptance of Club rules, and of dangerous or anti-social behaviour.

Neither the ESA/ESTEC Fencing Club, nor the ESTEC Sports, Social and Cultural Committee (SSCC), nor ESA is liable for personal injury or damage to the club member's property during normal club activities, notwithstanding reasonable expectations that those parties will conduct their business in a safe environment.
